For the first time, Beckers' sustainability reporting in 2015 is in accordance with the Global Reporting Initiative's (GRI) G4 core option. The reporting consists of a separate sustainability report and additional information published on Beckers' website. All of Beckers' 33 entities in 17 countries are included into the report. The GRI Index in this document compiles indicator information and explains any omissions to the reported data. The data has not been externally audited.
